5. Scheduled Appointments

a. Jennifer Piercy and Denise Allen, County Commissioners' Association of WV, to discuss 2021 Legislative Session and American Rescue Plan Funding.

Counties will directly receive the money from the rescue plan. The annual meeting at Canaan will be focused largely on ARP.

A work group has been formed and will be working on the costs of mental hygiene cases.

An interim session will be June 6 – 8. There is a committee that is reviewing the costs of the regional jail system.

The 2021 legislative session focused on the 1% sales tax. The Association does support the 1% sales tax bill.

Senate Bill 12, which brings local health departments under the control of the appointing authority such as the Commission.

There were three evaluation bills dealing with real property, coal, and oil & gas. The oil & gas bill did pass.

HJR 3 was a house joint resolution that passed. This will appear on the November 2022 ballot. If passed, it will give future legislature the authority to exempt machinery and equipment, business tangible personal property used in business activity, eliminate the personal property tax on vehicles. This could be up to \$500,000,000 in general revenue that could be affected.

House Bill 2002 passed regarding broadband. Senate Bill 270 passed which provides for the collection of taxes by hotel market place facilitators. Senate Bill 488 passed and it related to hotel motel tax. Senate Bill 565 did not pass but will be come back up. This bill was related to elections. Senate Bill 613 will allow permanent funding for the back log of cases with the State Police.

The counties were not included in the legal advertisement bill.

House Bill 2014 relates to the role of the legislature in appropriating federal funds.

b. Larry Wrathford & Jeffrey Teter, Maysville Volunteer Fire Company, request funding for extrication equipment.

Jeffrey stated that they were asking for assistance with the purchase of some new rescue equipment. The fire department has lost over \$100,000 in revenue due to COVID.

Commissioner Miley asked how much money they were needing. Jeffrey stated that it is \$36,644.00 for everything.

c. Bobby Funk, Grant County Ambulance, to discuss status change of an employee.

Bobby stated that Jessica Whitehead is resigned from the ambulance due to being promoted in the military. Carol Severe is requesting to go to part-time status due to her health.

Bobby stated that he has two part-time employees that want to go full-time. They are Renee and Daniel Linn.

A Motion was made to accept the above employee changes. **MOTION: Berg**

Bobby stated that he has a student, Ashly Sites, that he would like to hire part-time once she has her certifications. She will be a driver until she passes her EMT.

Bobby stated he is still looking for some full-time help on the mountain. He is going to change the schedule so that there is more coverage.

There are some ambulances having shortage issues.

Bobby stated that the new billing system is working well.

Bobby stated that they may need to purchase a dual band radio in the event that they purchase a box ambulance due to lack of space.

d. Dennis Rogers, Grant County Housing Authority, to present an update on the Grant County Housing Authority.

Mr. Rogers stated there are 26 units in addition to Woodland Terrace. He stated that 149 families are serviced through the Housing Authority. This year \$200,000.00 was given back to landlords. He stated that there are three employees, two of which are on call 24/7. This summer he stated he would hire 3 - 4 part-time employees to assist with mowing grass.

e. Bud Fisher, County Clerk, to present order for approval to complete procedures to change Precinct polling location from Corners Methodist Church in Cabins to Camp Echo Dining Hall.

Mr. Fisher told the Commission that he swore Lora Bennett in as Deputy Clerk.


WHEREAS the COUNTY has continuously and competently fulfilled the requirements and responsibilities of the Operation and Maintenance requirements of the Petersburg, West Virginia, South Branch of the Potomac River and Lunice Creek Flood Levee Protection System since its completed construction in July 1993.


WHEREAS the COUNTY had performed, and will continue to perform, the provisions as set forth in the Local Flood Protection Project, Operation and Maintenance Manual as developed by the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) dated October 1997.

WHEREAS it is further stated and reiterated, that the COUNTY accepts the ultimate responsibility for the tasks and actions as listed in the USACE Project Cooperation Agreement for said Operations and Maintenance Manual of the Local Flood Protection Project.




