

WHEREAS, Overdose Awareness Day sends a strong message to current and former drug users that they are valued; and





WHEREAS, the impact of mental health and substance use disorders is apparent in our local community; and


WHEREAS, through Recovery Month, people become more aware and able to recognize the signs of mental health and substance use disorders; and


